The Boarding experience encourages tolerance, respect for others, kindness, spiritual and moral awareness and self-discipline. It develops independence and the strength and ability of the individual to function as part of ateam.

Care is taken to ensure a similar ethos and atmosphere across the Hostels, whilst at the same time maintaining the individual character of each Hostel and ensuring a progression of responsibilities and privileges commensurate with the different age groups. 2. INTRODUCTION

Starville Boarding school is a state of the art facility deliberately set up to accommodate students aged 11 to 16. Boarding is full time, with student only leaving the school on official school holidays. The boarding school is cared for by experienced boarding teachers. We aim at bringing back discipline, vocational skills and academic excellence synonymous with the boarding schools of old but in a modern facility. We plan to return your children back to you each term many times better than when they left home for school, when you look at all areas of their life. We also ensure that they learn for life with a range of academic, cultural, sporting and social events which ultimately develop independence and initiative.

Boarders at *Starville School* are members of a unique extended family. They can expect to receive a quality of care and attention that is surpassed only by that received in their loving family homes. Boarding staff are professional men and women who aim to facilitate a well-balanced College and home experience for your children.

There is certainly no place like home, but young people are good at adapting to new challenges. In their boarding house, the biggest challenge for the student is to be aware of the needs of a number of other people around them, much as they would be expected to do in a larger family. To help them meet this challenge, our boarding staff demand a high level of conformity to routine and encourage the students to develop a sense of community.

Though there are specific rules, consequences and rewards attached to many actions in the boarding house, all students are encouraged to be self-disciplined. The aim is to promote the initiative, growth and responsibility that is appropriate for young men and women.

Your child will be well cared for and treated with respect. At the same time, the Hostel will challenge him/her to achieve his/her best in all areas so that he/she makes a valuable contribution to the hostel community and develops a healthy level of self- respect. They will be given many opportunities to use these skills and initiative in a supportive and structured environment.

4. ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT OF STARVILLE SCHOOLBOARDING

The Director of Boarding

The Director of Boarding is responsible for the direction and oversight of the boarding Hostel. The Director of Boarding reports to the Principal.

Matron/Patron

The Matron/Patron assumes responsibility for all other House parents while overlooking the activities of the boys and girls in her/his care. He/she reports directly to the Director of Boarding. He/ She is the primary contact point for the parents. He/She also lives in the same house as the boys/girls in his/her care.

The House Coordinators/Parents

The House Coordinator/parent assumes responsibility for the boys/girls in his or her care. They monitor the day-to-day care of the students. These staff members live in the same house as the boys/girls in their care. They provide after-hours care and work on a normal supervision roster.

Prep Supervisors

When on duty, supervisors assume immediate responsibility for the boys/girls in their care. In conjunction with the House Coordinators they contribute to the day-to-day study time and care of the boys/girls.

5. YOUR CHILD ANDBOARDING

(i) Preparation

Once you have made the decision to have your child board at Starville school, consider taking a number of opportunities that may constitute useful preparation for the boarding life.

For a start, your child should feel comfortable with the idea; talk about it as much as necessary. It may be useful to have your child spend some time away from the family, perhaps by visiting friends or extended family, as a way of developing his/her sense of independence. He/she should be encouraged to develop those skills necessary for independent living; bed making; caring for clothing; being aware of personal hygiene requirements. A daily routine of chores at home will be carried through inboarding.

(ii) Homesickness

Boarding school can never replace home or the presence of the family unit, and a period of adjustment to this new situation is therefore normal. It should be noted that homesickness is absolutely normal and most boarders will experience this at some stage. It is best not to panic but to reassure your child that everything will be ok and the feeling will settle in time. It is advisable in such instances to avoid excessive contact with him/her; this can often exacerbate the homesickness. Rather, maintaining contact with your childs House Coordinator is a more useful way of ensuring that all iswell.

6. SCHOOL RULES ANDREGULATION

These rules have been framed to make the School and Boarding community a place of which we are all proud of and within which we can live happily, safely, and productively. The rules of behaviour at Starville School are generally more stringent than those that may be enforced at home. Students should arrive prepared to abide by all expectations and rules.

The rules of the Boarding Program have been established to:

- Ensure the safety of students
- Preserve harmony so that energy can be directed toward studies, extracurricular activities, and the development offriendships
- Provide quiet times so students can study and relax from the stresses of theday
- Maintain an attractive, clean environment in which students can becomfortable

It is important to remember that these rules were made for teenagers living in a group situation. The Boarding Staff strive to maintain a balance between flexibility and consistency in enforcing rules. Although consistency is usually desirable, it will not always be the principle governing matters of discipline.

Discipline will be handled clearly and justly in addition to penalties.

A. PAYMENT OFFEES

BOARDING FEE

The Boarding School is a pre-paid service on first come, first served basis at the beginning of the term for those that had stayed in the hostel for the previous term first and then new boarders who have been cleared by the front desk personnel to go ahead and make payment. We do not reserve bed spaces for boarders that are yet to pay boarding fees at the beginning of the term. Boarding fees together with the school fees must be paid according to the STARVILLE PAYMENT PROCEDURE. (Payment procedure: Appendixii)

PAYMENT ON RESUMPTION DATE

We would not accept any payment/ bank drafts on the day of resumption. Please clarifications of all payment related issues and clearance of all payment made should be obtained from the account office before resumption into the hostel.

All fees must be paid in full on arrival.

B. GROOMING

After each College holiday students are expected to return to the school ready to begin the term. This means they arrive at their boarding house well-groomed and with an appropriate haircut/Hair do.

GIRLS: Hair extensions, braids and beads are not allowed for the girls. The acceptable hair for girls is weaving with their hair.

Hair must be made before resumption.

BOYS: Boys cannot come in with patterns cut on their hair or longer than acceptable level. The boys are to carry even low cut without any style.

Any boarder that defaults in hairdo will not be allowed into the hostel. He/she is expected to correct the hair and still resume not later than 24 hours after and will face disciplinary action upon resumption.

JEWELLERY

Students do not need to wear jewellery while they are on the school's property. A watch will suffice.

C. BEGINNING AND END OFTERMS

1. RESUMPTION

TIME

All boarding students must resume between the hours of 4pm and 6pm.

Parents who come in to drop off their children must leave the school premises on or before 6:10pm.

DROP OFF

Students returning to school from vacation should plan to return to the hostels at the stipulated time (4-6pm) on the last day of vacation (Sunday). Parents are to sign in their children at the gate in the boarding register.

EARLY ARRIVAL

Students arriving earlier than the scheduled hostel resumption date will need to make arrangements to stay elsewhere until the hostels open.

LATE DROP OFF

Boarders will not be checked in after 6:00pm on resumption day.

RESUMPTION AFTER SCHEDULED DATE (SUNDAY)

All boarders resuming after the scheduled resumption date which is usually on Sunday, would only be checked in after each school day between the hours of 4pm and 6pm.

A parent/guardian must be present during check in to be done by teachers in the secondary building.

BAGS

All clothes must be ironed and well packed.

ACCOUNT CLEARANCE

On arrival, the accounts personnel will first clear the boarder. Failure to be cleared by accounts department means denial of entry into the hostel.

After clearance, the boarder is accompanied by parents with his/her luggage to check-in arena.

CHECK-IN

All boys move towards male staff in the stipulated hall while girls move towards the female staff in their own hall. All bags must be checked based on the Check-list provided by the school (Checklist: Appendix iii). All contraband or unwanted items are confiscated; all incomplete items are communicated to the parents for immediate completion. This must be done before 6pm on the arrival day. This means that the boarder will leave with his/her parents to complete the items and return to school on or before6:00pm.

DRESS CODE ON ARRIVAL

Dress code on arrival to Starville School must be house wear for the returning and new students.

WITHOUT HOUSE WEAR

If for any reason the boarder's house wear is not available, a pair of blue jeans and a white t-shirt will suffice.

INCOMPLETE ITEMS

Only boarders with all items on the checklist will be checked into the school at the beginning of any term.

(v) ITEMS TO BE GIVEN BYSCHOOL

- a. 2 pairs of extra schooluniform
- **b.** 6 housewears
- **C.** 1 Sunday wear (black skirt/trouser with whitetop)
- d. 1 Saturday sportswear (black joggers with branded sportsshirt)
- **e.** 2bedsheets/pillowcases
- f. 1duvet

D. HOSTELCLOSURE

The hostels are closed for Christmas, Salah celebration, Easter, mid -term breaks and school vacations.

LEAVING THE HOSTEL

Students will not be allowed to leave for holidays before the stipulated closing date and time.

PICKUP TIMING

All boarders must be picked up on the day of vacation as communicated by hostel administration.

PACKING UP

All belongings of the boarder are packed up a night before departure and left beside thebed.

- If going to class in the morning, the belongings are to be kept neatly by thebed.

PICK UP

- At pick up time, all boarders are to move all belongings to the hall and be seated with a houseparent.
- One of the house parents will be situated downstairs by hostel entrance to receive the parents and call the childrendown.
- The house parent with the boarders must ensure all items belonging to each child is moved down with the child while leaving thehostel.

SIGN OUT

Parents picking up their children from the hostels must sign them out in the boarding register at the school's main gate.

LOCK UP

- Before house parents leave for the day, they must ensure that the hostels have been tidied up and all unclaimed items neatly packed up and kept instorage.
- Any items forgotten by a boarder that is kept in storage can only be pickedup after the hostel staff has resumed for the nextterm.

INTENT TO RETURN FORM

Two weeks to the end of every term, a clearance form will be sent via e-mail to all boarders. Part of the information contained is whether the boarder would be returning to the hostel in the subsequent term. This is especially useful to our boarding administration as it helps in planning for the number of boarders being expected. All parents are expected to fill and return this form at most, a week to vacation.

(Intent to return form: Appendix i)

Failure to do so automatically means no show of interest and the bed space will be given out to an interested party.

D. HOSTEL

I. CHORES

DUTY ROTA: At the beginning of every term, there is a duty rota for each of the hostels respectively. Boarders are expected to work according to the rota to keep their environment clean. Every boarder is held accountable for the duty assigned per time.

a. ROOM CLEANING: The boarders are expected to tidy their individual spaces on daily basis and in the absence of employed cleaners on Sunday, clean other assigned areas to ensure the hygiene of the entirecommunity.

Rooms at this time should be clean, beds made neatly, bags packed neatly and cupboards neat and tidy. Laundry bags should be put away and shoes packed at the bottom compartment of your cupboard and not on the floor of your room.

b. LAUNDRY: Each boarder is expected to carry out his/her laundry by him/herself. This entails washing of one's clothes and ironing them. It doesn't just end there, while clothes are washed, each boarder is expected to monitor his/her own clothes during drying then bring them in and ensure they are kept in good conditions. Boys wash on Fridays while Girls wash on Saturdays.

ii. SIESTA

Siesta is compulsory for every boarder. Noisemaking, chattering and roaming around are prohibited at this time.

Failure to observe siesta will lead to standing by the hostel door until siesta is over. Repeated occurrences will be escalated to Director of Hostels/ Principal for further disciplinary actions.

iii. LIGHTSOUT

We expect students to honour the lights out hours (see hostel procedures). Being out of the hostel after lights out is a serious breach of trust and safety. Lights must be turned off after lights out.

ROAMING

Any boarder caught moving around or talking after lights out will be made to sit down in the corridor for 3 hours.

ANOTHER ROOM

On the other hand, if found in another person's corner, on the bed or under the bed, after lights out, 2 weeks suspension from the hostel is applied.

(Hostel Routines: Appendix iv)

iv.PREP

There are two preps observed every day except on Sundays when it is only night prep observed.

Afternoon prep: This is for an hour and a half after siesta. Teachers are assigned to aid the boarders in completing their assignments etc.

Evening prep: It starts immediately after dinner and the boarders are allowed to carry out their personal reading time guided by house parents.

PREP RULES

- (i) **Punctuality:** You must report early for prep. Lateness to prep will attract kneeling down for 10 minutes.
- (ii) **Noisemaking:** Boarders must work quietly during prep. Noisemaking or engaging in non-productive behavior is unacceptable. You will be made to sit in the Home Economics laboratory for yourprep.
- (iii) **Absence:** All boarders must be present for prep classes as absence from prep will not be tolerated. Any absence without permission from the Principal during prep hours attracts the cleaning of all dining halltables.
- (iv) **Use of restroom:** Boarders are not allowed to use the restrooms in the hostels during prep. Only the restrooms in the halls can be used at thistime.

V. DINING HALL/ MEALS: All students take their meals in the Boarder's dining hall. Meals and menu are designed according to the health benefits/nutritional value of the food. This is aimed at achieving a nutritionalbalance.

They receive:

i. morningtea

ii. breakfast

iii. lunch

iv.dinnr

v."night cap" (Menu:

DINING RULES

- All boarders must be punctual to eachmeal
 - They must be dressed properly; singlets, pyjamas or a bathroom slipper or the wrong shoes are notacceptable.
- They line up in a single file to collect theirfood
- They must be respectful to kitchen staff as they collect theirfood
- They walk quietly to their assigned seats and settledown
- They must have their napkins and correctcutlery
- At the completion of grace, eating commences.
- Boarders are not allowed to carry food (snacks, drinks) to thehostel.

LATENESS TO MEAL

Being late or absent from meals will not be tolerated. You will be made to wash all the plates in the kitchen.

F. UNIFORM ANDDRESSING

Boarders must be clean and modest in their appearance. Clothing is to be in good condition, not ragged, undersized, faded and without patches.

Any cloned uniform or uniform parts will be confiscated and not returned to the boarder.

The school has four types of uniforms namely:

- (i) **School uniform**: Boarders are required to wear complete school uniform to class. This is made upof:
- Neat and clean school navy blue skirt/trousers which must be worn around the waist (NO SAGGING)- (2 given at point of entry intoschool)
- Skirt must be to the knee cap orlonger
 - Clean and neat white short-sleeved school shirt, with full buttons and mustbe properly buttoned (2 given at point of entry intoschool)
- Shirt must be tuckedin
- Black leather belt must be visible for malestudents.
- A navy blue with red stripes tie (2 given at initialresumption)
- A pair of navy blue branded school socks –(5 pairs given at entry intoschool)
- A navy blue branded long-sleeved cardigan (to be worn on colddays)
- A navy blue branded Blazer (to be worn on assembly days/ outingdays)
- A pair of black leather school shoes (NOTBOOTS)
- (ii) **House wear:** Every boarder is given; i, 6

housewears,

- ii, A check dress for females/pair of
- iii. A check trouser and shirt for males.

These are in a variety of colours which represent the different houses; yellow, blue, green, red, purple. They are worn after school from Monday to Friday, and then on Saturday after sports.

- (iii) Sunday wear: A pair of black trousers (boys)/ skirt (girls) and a white long-sleevedshirt.
- (iv) **Sportswear:** For the boarders, there are two different sportswears:
- a. A pair of shorts/ skirt according to the different house colours with a school branded white t-shirt worn during school hours on SportsDay.
- b. A black pair of joggers and a school branded white t-shirt for weekend sports.

Footwear: Any sport shoe of choice.

(V) Footwear: A pair of white sports shoes (canvas) worn with navy blueschool brandedsocks.

CONSEQUENCE OF NOT DRESSING WELL

Any defaulter for improper dressing will be excluded from the function.

G. FUNCTIONS

The school allows the boarders to participate in a number of social activities. There are certain requirements for attires to be worn for the events.

- Clothing should be neat (not faded, torn or ripped or undersized), clean and in goodstate.
- Students should not wear clothing with sexual, alcohol, nicotine, or otherdrugs references.
- Extremely short garments or clothes that are too revealing areinappropriate.

i. CLOTHING FOR SCHOOLFUNCTIONS

We encourage students to bring clothing items needed for school functions per term. These include but not limited to:

Culture Day: Any attire that represents the culture the boarder wants to represent.

Valentine's Day (Feb. 14th): A pair of jeans with a top that has a touch of red.

School/Class End-of-Year Party: A pair of jeans and a t-shirt that has one of the Christmas colours. (green, white, gold, red)

This will be communicated to boarders at the end of every term and through the end of term newsletters for parents to help them prepare ahead of time.

Please take note, parents will not be allowed to bring in or send any cloths/ items after the child has been brought back to the hostel.

H. RECREATION

Students have many opportunities to undertake recreational activities, both formal and informal. They have access to extensive grounds for sports, Indoor activities and other vocation activities.

i. **SPORT**

They are involved in full seasons of sporting fixtures. Fridays are for Football League where the male and female teams play with their counterparts from day school.

Saturday sports include football, volleyball, badminton, basketball, table tennis and fitness sessions.

ii. **VOCATIONALTRAINING**

Boarders receive Vocational trainings over the weekend. The era of skill acquisition is fast taking over head knowledge. These involve the use of trained personnel and materials which will attract extra cost for the boarders.

ACTIVITIES REQUIRING ADDITIONAL COST

- IT: Coding/Programming will be taught to the boarders who have shown interest in this vocation.
- Dressmaking: Fabrics and sewing kits will be made available during this training.
- Plumbing: This vocation teaches hands-on repairs for homefixtures.
 - Culinary: Here, the boarders will be put through the techniques of bakingand cooking.
 - Hair making: This is available for boarders who want to add the skill of hair making to the learning acquired in school. This skill teaching is available every otherweek.
 - Beading: Boarders who are interested in beading are taught to make exquisite designs. The cost of the training and the materials needed will reflect in the boarders' fee as the activity takes off. It is a project-based skillacquisition.

• Animal husbandry which includes snail and rabbit farming: Every boarder in the hostel is expected to belong to a group whose weekend task is to check up on the snails and rabbits in the school farm. They are to help the school gardener in feeding and caring for theanimals.

I. STUDENT

LEADERSHIP i.Prefects

The hostels have a leadership program, which allows students to shape directly the community in which they live.

- The student leaders, called Prefects, help in the Management of the hostel and address topics of mutualconcern.
- Each hostel has one or two prefects.
 - Prefects are selected by staff on the basis of personal integrity, communityrespect, and the ability to lead theirpeers.
 - By acting as student/staff liaisons and leading by example, the Prefects set a positive tone for their community.

ii. PrefectResponsibilities

Prefects have the following responsibilities:

- Assist with new studentorientation
- Assist Boarding staff withPrep.
- Assist with planning and organizing HouseFunctions.
 - Ensure that all hostel students are present for hostel meetings and otherevents.

iii. PrefectExpectations

Prefects are role models and leaders. Being a prefect is a challenge and an honor

- They are expected to promote, support, and follow all the rules at this school.
 - Their conduct in every aspect of their life here at Starville School is under scrutiny by students and adults.
 - Prefects will undergo an evaluation process with the Boarding Staff and Headof School throughout theyear.
 - In cases where Prefects do not meet these expectations their status as Prefect may beremoved.

- Accordingly, any prefect breaking a major school rule may automatically lose his or her status as aprefect.
- If a prefect violates a boarding rule, he or she may lose his or her status if the infraction and the circumstances surrounding it are seen by the Principal as compromising the prefect's leadershipability.

J. MENTAL/EMOTIONALWELLBEING

Boarding students are supported by a network of people who care for their emotional, spiritual and physical wellbeing at Starville School. These include:

- Supervisory staff members who are professional adults that oversee the care of the boarders and provide ready advice or just readyshoulders.
- Counsellors who are available to the boarders by referral orappointment.

CASES NEEDING PROFESSIONAL ATTENTION

- There are some emotional issues ranging from severe depression to suicidal thoughts and actions that are beyond the capacity of our counsellors and trained personnel.
- In such cases that cannot be handled by the school, the parent is advised to withdraw the boarder from the hostel and in some cases, the school, forbetter monitoring andhandling.

K. HEALTH

i. WellnessCentre

- During and after school hours, boarders have access to the school's Wellness Centre which is operated by qualifiednurses.
- Medical care is provided to the students whenever the needarises
 - Any medication brought to school by a boarder must be handed over tothe schoolNurse.

SELF MEDICATION

- Self-medication is notallowed

SERIOUS HEALTH CHALLENGES

- In serious health challenges, the parents are called to pick the boarder for better medicaltreatment.

ii. Communication of Healthstatus

- The school insists on a thorough medical check-up for all new boarding intakes.
- We have provided e-medical forms for each child given accommodation in the hostel. (Appendixvi).
- This form must be returned upon entry into the hostel in order to enable the school handle medical cases that may come up and we assure you of its confidentiality.

iii. Wellness CentreRules

- All boarders must have written consent for visiting the WellnessCentre.
- Clinic times are before school, recess, and lunch and after school. Urgent problems are accepted out of clinic hours withoutnotes.
- All visits to the centre must be documented by the schoolNurse.

L. VISITORS

- Boarders are not allowed to receive visitors or communicate withany visitors (parents and siblings inclusive) except it is a visitingday.
- No parent is allowed to drop any item with the security personnel for their child/ward in thehostel.

NON-RESIDENT

- Students no longer residing in the hostel are not allowed inside the hostel for visits in the course of a schoolday.
- Collection of food/snacks from non-boarders or staff members (even as small as bubble gum etc.) is not acceptable and will lead to withdrawal from thehostel.

i. VISITINGDAY

- Once every term, parents are allowed to visit their children/ wards inschool.
- This is the second Saturday before the start of examinations everyterm.
- The timing runs from 10am to 4pm on the visitingSaturday.
 - Parents are allowed to bring in other family members and friends and any kind of edibles for theboarder.

LEFT OVER FOODITEMS

The leftover food items from visiting days must be taken home by parents/ guardians. Any leftovers found with boarders after visiting day will be confiscated andtrashed.

M. COMMUNI CATION OTHERSTUDENTS

- Parents are implored not to communicate with their children/wards through other students who are not in the hostel or their parents.
- We also do not encourage letters via daystudents.

CHECKING IN ON CHILDREN

- Parents are also not allowed to check on their children except it is a visiting day. This is to help themfocus.
- Please do not send someone else to do so on your behalf nor send in food stuff or other items to yourchild/ward.

DROP OFF AT SCHOOL GATE

- Items dropped off at the school gate will not be accepted by these curity personnel.
- This means that all items on the school checklist for the term mustbe complied with.
- If there is any cogent reason to get across to the parents, it will be done officially.

CONSEQUENCES

- Subsequently, any such actions will be treated as flagrant disobedience of hostel rules and the boarder asked to leave the hostel without *recourse to already paid boardingfees*.

N. CELEBRATIONS

- **Birthday:** Parents are allowed to celebrate their children/wards' birthdays after pre-informing the hostelparents.
- **School- Day**: For a school day, items can be brought in by break time which is at 10:00am which affords the parent the opportunity to take pictures of the ward with his/her classmates if they so desire, after which the items are dropped off with the hostelparents.

- Weekend: If the birthday falls on a weekend, items are allowed to be brought in by11:00am.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- The acceptable items for birthday celebrations of boarders are cake(s) and drinksonly.
- **Resumption/Vacation:** Birthdays cannot be celebrated on the first and or last days of the schoolterm.
- **Examination period:** As a school rule, birthdays are also not allowed during school examination period.

O.EXEAT

(i) PICK UP OF BOARDERS IN BETWEEN SCHOOLPERIODS

- Boarders are NOT allowed to be picked up in between the term asthis interrupts their studies, emotions and general schooltime.
- Parents are to schedule all medical appointments, religious activities like confirmations, and family engagements during their mid-term or end of termholidays.
- Only emergency medical issues or bereavement of direct relatives will be allowed for pickup in the term.
- We would endeavour to send the next term schedule ahead of time to give plenty room for yourplans
- Any parent that insists on picking the child/ward from the hostel will not be permitted to bring the child back for the rest of the term without recourse to boarding feespaid.

(ii) LEAVE

In an effort to have the students to see as much of their families as possible the School calendar allows for a number of days off school.

- Midterm Break: The boarders return home for an extended weekend visit during the midterm break. All boarders leave the College at thistime.
- Extended public holidays: The school can also decide to allow theboarders go home if the Government announces an extended publicholiday.

- As a result, boarders leave the school grounds only when permission has been granted by the Director of Boarding with the approval of the Principal/ Director of School.

P. SEXUAL-RELATEDISSUES

We expect every student to exercise restraint with respect to sexual activity. Sexual intimacy between students is not appropriate at this age level.

Students should refrain from these while on campus and in the school hostel rooms or lounges:

- (i) intimatetouching
- (ii) kissing
- (iii) closecuddling
 - Students are not allowed to lie down together on the lounge couches or on the hostelbeds.
- No Girls in Boys hostels and vice-versa.
- Boarders must not be found in opposite sexrestrooms(bathroom/toilet)
 - In the event that a boarder is involved in homosexual/ bisexual/heterosexual relationship with another boarder, boarders or day students and the person is caught or reported, an inquiry is setup.
 - Once confirmed to be true, the school reserves the authority to communicate to the parents the findings of theschool
 - The school will also ask for immediate withdrawal of the child from the boarding house and school.

Q. EXAMINATIONS

(i) EXAMINATIONMALPRACTICE

- As a school, our students are aware of our zero tolerance for exam malpractice.
- In view of this, we reiterate this for ourboarders.
- Any boarder caught in any kind of malpractice ranging from but not limited to copying from the textbook during exams, taking an external sheet into the exam with answers written, keeping books in the toilet to read during an exam etc will be automatically expelled from theschool.

(ii) EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

- All examinations entered for the boarders by the school will be done bythe boarders while in school except otherwisecommunicated.
- This means that the boarders in examination classes (SS3) will be charged extra to enable the school register them, move them to and from their examination venues.

R. OUT- OF- BOUNDAREAS

The following areas are categorized as out- of- bound areas;

- Other people's classrooms, Hostels orrestrooms.
 - Alone in classroom area with ateacher
 - ➤ House parents'rooms
 - > The Dining hallalone
- Kitchen areaunsupervised
- **Laboratories**
- ➤ Security/gatehouse
- > Farm
- > Sports fields unsupervised by astaff

CONSEQUENCES

Breaking of any of the above rules, carries a minimum sanction of a Weekend detention and a maximum sanction of expulsion from the hostel and school.

Remember the rules are there for your safety and your families' peace of mind. The benefit of being a well behaved, productive member of the Starville family is a lifetime of good memories, life experiences and friends from every corner of the world.

S. CONTRABANDITEMS

- Jewellery: Earrings must be one pair of simple studs (girls only) and awristwatch. No other items of jewellery are permitted.
- Food/snack (Edible provisions, Chewing gum etc are not allowed in theschool)
- > Money
 - ➤ Any item not in the boarders' checklist
 - Make-up is notallowed.
 - Digital/ electronic and any internet gadgets like mobile phones, / play stereo/MP4 or mp3players

- ➤ Black leather belts with large or overly styledbuckles
- ➤ Non- schoolshoes/sandals
- > Alcohol
- Drugs (be it hard or medications forailments)
- ➤ Wristbands

Confiscated contraband will not be returned to boarders or their parents.

T. BODY PIERCINGS ANDTATTOO

All forms of body piercing are not permitted

U. DAMAGES

- Every damaged door lock will attract a surcharge of not less than N5000 only.
- Any damage caused by a boarder will be communicated to the parents for repair/payment at a bill to be determined by schoolauthority.

V. MOBILE PHONES/ INTERNETDEVICES

Mobile phones/smart watches and internet devices are not allowed in the boarding house and is punishable with EXPULSION.

W. BULLYING

- Bullying of any form is not permitted in thehostel.
 - If a boarder is reported to be bullying another child, an investigation will be carriedout
- After which the parents of the boarder will be communicated to.
- This attracts automatic expulsion from thehostel.

Policy on Bullying

STARVILLE SCHOOL Boarding House has a "Zero Tolerance" policy towards bullying behaviour and any bullying will be treated very seriously. Any boarder that suspects his/herself being bullied should talk with a Boarding Staff/management staff member immediately.

Definition and Identifying Factors

Generally, bullying is a behaviour intended to hurt others, whether verbal or physical, and is typically repeated over time.

Bullying often involves most or all of the following:

- A desire to hurt
- Hurtful action
- A power imbalance
- Unjust use of power
- Repetition (usually)

- Satisfaction by aggressor
- Sense of oppression by victim

Some Examples of Bullying

- Saying hurtful and unpleasant things
- Making fun of others
- Using mean and hurtful nicknames
- Body shaming
- Completely overlooking someone
- Deliberately excluding someone from a group of friends
- Hitting, kicking, pulling hair, pushing or shutting a person inside
- Telling lies / Spreading false rumours
- Sending mean notes
- Trying to get other students to dislike another person

Dealing with a bullying situation

- Do NOT do nothing this can contribute to the bullying
- Ensure own safety before acting
- If you feel comfortable with stopping the bullying peacefully, act immediately, with fact and care.
- You should also be friend / offer support to the victim after the situation.
- Get help from a responsible adult
- Make sure both the victim and the person displaying bullying behaviour receive attention from a responsible senior or staff member
- Always talk to a member of Boarding Staff about the situation immediately after any of the above

Dealing with a bullying complaint

If someone approaches you with a complaint that might involve bullying, always treat the matter seriously:

• Make sure the person being bullied and others are safe. You may need to comfort the victim(s).

Try to find out the following information and write it down:

- Who was involved
- o Details about the hurtful action (what happened & by who, where and when)
- How the victim reacted to the actions
- o What events have occurred prior to the current incident
- o Whether the victim provoked the bullying person
- Suggest seeing a responsible member of staff to deal with the issue together.
- If asked about confidentiality, you can offer confidentiality from other boarders, but you cannot keep confidentiality from the Boarding Staff.
- Always talk to a member of boarding staff about the situation immediately after any of the above.

X. GENERAL

SCHOOLRULES I.

- No Climbing walls, rails, roofs ortrees.
 - No balls games are allowed in classrooms area or close tobuildings
 - No one is allowed in the kitchen or dining hall unless on duty Rota and supervised by a member ofstaff.

- Jewellery: earrings must be one pair of simple studs (girls only) and awristwatch. No other items of jewellery are permitted. All forms of body piercing are not permitted.
- ➤ Chewing gum is not allowed in the school. Chewing gum= Weekenddetention.
- > Students must respect the hostel. NoLitter.
 - Students must always be neat and tidy. Top buttons of shirts must befastened and ties up to the collar and properly tied. Ties must be an appropriatelength.
- Make-up is notallowed.
- Students should follow the instruction of the prefects/teachers/sectionalheads.
 - Shoes must be polished and clean. And laces must be tied. Black schoolshoes only.
 - Skirts must not be rolled and must be worn below the knee. Socks cannot be rolled in or dragged into the shoes
- ➤ All accidents should be reportedimmediately.

ii. CLASSRULES

- Arrive on time, with the necessary books and equipment.
- Line up neatly and quietly in singlefile.
- Enter classroom quietly and stand behind yourchair.
 - Once the teacher and class has exchanged greetings your will be instructed tobe seated.
 - The classroom is a place of learning. Concentrate hard on your work and allow others tolearn.
- Treat others, their work and equipment withrespect.
- Listen to the views or comments of others, even if different form yourown.
- Eat only at meal times and breaks not inclass.
- Use appropriate language at alltimes.
- Raise your hand when wanting to ask or answer aquestion.
- Always acknowledge visitors to the class by standing and greetingthen.
- Follow all instructions given.
- ➤ If in doubt.ask!!
- Complete all work to the best of yourability.
- Present work neatly and accurately.
 - All pieces of written work should have a date, whether the piece is classwork or prep and the title neatly underlined with a ruler. TIPPEX is not allowed for mistakes, a single ruled horizontal line should be used.

- Expect to repeat or complete the work again if it is unsatisfactory.
- Punctuation, spelling and good use of grammar is very important in alllessons.
- ➤ Keep books and your prep diary free fromgraffiti.
- > Complete all prep and return it ontime.
- > Stay seated at all times unless you are asked to move by theteacher.
- ➤ Do not rock on the chairs or sit on the tables, as this will causedamage.
 - No use of mobile phones or mp3 players in class, dining hall or school buildings.

iii. HOSTELRULES

- 1. We expect students to honour the lights out hours. Being out of the hostel after lights out is a serious breach of trust andsafety.
- 2. We expect every student to exercise restraint with respect to sexual activity. Sexual intimacy between students is not appropriate at this age level. Students should refrain from intimate touching including kissing and close cuddling while on campus and in the school hostel rooms or lounges. Students may not lie down together on the lounge couches or on the hostel beds. No Girls in Boys hostels and vice-versa.
- **3.** We expect students to abstain from the use of incense, candles, orother incendiary items in the hostels and buildings at StarvilleSchool.
- **4.** There will be no possession, use, distribution or display of alcohol, beverages containing alcohol (or the containers), nicotine, drug paraphernalia, marijuana, and/or other illicit or dangerous drugs of any kind on or off campus. Any over-the- counter or prescription drug used for a purpose other than its primary indication will be consideredillicit.
- **5.** Starville is a violence-free campus. Acts or threats of violence, including bullying or harassment, will be treated with utmostseriousness.

- **6.** Honesty: Students are expected to be open and honest in their interactions with Boarding Staff. Lying or attempting to deceive or hide information cancreate an atmosphere of distrust. Even when a student has broken a rule, the boarding staff have much more respect for a student who is able to be truthful about what he or she did, rather than further the problem by beingdeceitful.
- 7. Hostel students cannot use tobacco products on or off campus while they are enrolled at Starville School. Smoking in the hostels will result in immediate expulsion.
- **8.** Sunday evenings are observed strictly. Inspection of rooms, uniforms, sports equipment and schoolbooks. School shoes are to be placed beside the bed polished. No one is to be walking around the hostel and should be preparing for the weekahead.
- **9.** Toilets should be left in an acceptable state. Remember the daily cleaning staff are not your slaves and are an important part of a happy Hostel. A cleaning Rota is to be set by HouseParents.
- 10. Duty-week prefect to make sure the house members set up the Hall on Saturdays for Sunday morning fellowship.
- 11. No visitors allowed in Hostels, members only. Visiting friends are not permitted except on agreed days by the school and is done in common areas within theschool.
- 12. Communication with parents are not allowed except done officially as permitted by the schoolauthorities.
- 13. Students no longer residing in the hostel are not allowed inside thehostel.
- **14.** Collection of food/snacks from non-boarders or staff members (even as small as bubble gum etc) is not acceptable and attracts REMOVAL FROM THEHOSTEL.

Demerits

When students commit minor infractions they receive a demerit. A Boarding staff member or prefect for a number of infractions may give a demerit. A student who receives a total of three demerits in a term will be on Principal's Detention from 4:00 p.m. Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. Repeated Principal's Detention will be dealt with on a progressively serious basis. At the term's end any remaining Demerits will be erased and students start with a clean slate. You may receive a demerit for any of the offenses below.

- 1. Returning to the hostels between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. (except for Fridays to Sunday).
- 2. Being out of your hostel after check-in (6:00pm) and out of your room after 10:30 p.m. (11 p.m. for seniors).
- **3.** Neglecting to follow prep rules or engaging in nonproductive behaviour.
- 4. Locking your door during day, while you are in theroom.
- **5.** Not reporting for prep, or reporting inlate.
- 7. Having your lights on, moving around or discussing after lightsout.
 - 8. Being in an opposite gender Hostel. (Will lead to expulsion)
- **9.** Being in an opposite gender rest room. (Will lead toexpulsion)
 - **10.** Using offensivelanguage.
 - 11. Being tooloud.
 - 12. Engaging in rough physical contact. (Suspension/Expulsion)
 - 13. Being disrespectful oruncooperative.
 - **14.** Having a messyroom.
 - 15. Misusing/ Damaging school property will attractpayment/replacement
 - 16. Dishonesty.
 - 17. Not using English language within the HOSTEL.
 - **18.** Being late or absent frommeals.
 - **19**. Being Late forinspection.
 - 20. Not Lining up correctly for EVENTS
 - **21.** Bullying in the hostel(Expulsion)

INVITATION OF PARENTS TO SCHOOL

There are times we invite parents of boarders to school. If your child continues to commit minor offenses or is refusing to cooperate within the hostel community. It is hoped that your presence as a parent will deter your child/ward from recalcitrant behaviours.

REPEATED OFFENSES

Repeated minor offenses might result in more severe consequences, as determined by the Boarding staff, Director of Hostel and Principal.

It is the hope of the Boarding staff that all punishments are served in a timely manner, are just and equal in dispensation. We do realize that certain circumstances require us to make unpopular decisions. Determined to do what is best for the community, we also realize that flexibility is a position of strength. We ask parents to support our actions and allow us to perform to the best of our abilities and the good of the School.

SUSPENSION FROM RESIDENCE HALLS

Some disciplinary offences are serious enough to result in removal from the hostel community. In these instances, the school authority will suspend or expel the student from the boarding house.

Prior to departing for any break, students must make sure their rooms are clean. This includes students participating in activities. Every room is inspected, and students are responsible for the cleanliness of their rooms, regardless of their weekend obligations. At year's end, cleaning and damages will be assessed by Boarding/Domestic Staff and charged to the student's residence account if there is excessive damage in a room.

Y.SUMMARY OF HOSTEL RULES AND APPLICABLESANCTIONS

- 1. All students must leave the hostel by 7:00 am from Mondays to Fridays.
 - **2.** All students must return to the hostel by 3:35 pm after school. No boarder is allowed to remain in class after others have been moved to the hostel except by special permission granted by the school authority. Any boarder who does not obey this rule will kneel down till it is time forprep.
 - **3.** All boarders must wear 'appropriate clothing' at all times.

- **4.** Siesta is compulsory for every boarder. Failure to observe siesta will lead tostanding by the hostel door until siesta is over. Repeated occurrences will be escalated to Director of Hostels/Principal.
- **5.** Neglecting to follow prep rules or engaging in non-productive behavior is unacceptable. You will be made to sit in the Home Economics laboratory for yourprep.
- **6.** You must report early for prep as absence from prep will not be tolerated. Any disobedience during prep hours attracts the cleaning of all dining halltables.
- 7. Lights must be turned off after lights out. Any boarder caught moving around or talking after lights out will be made to sit down in the corridor for 3 hours. On the other hand, if found in another person's corner, on the bed or under the bed, after lights out, 2 weeks suspension from the hostel isapplied.
- **8.** You must not be found in an opposite gender Hostel. This will lead to expulsion.
- **9.** You cannot use an opposite gender rest room. It will also lead to expulsion.
 - 10. Using offensive language is prohibited. You will be denied from participating in the social night for that week.
 - 11. Noise making is unacceptable hostel behavior. The hostel parents will apply the appropriate disciplinary sanction for this. (Ride bicycle for 10 minutes).
 - 12. Engaging in rough physical contact will NOT be condoned. Any fighting in the hostel leads to expulsion from thehostel.
 - 13. Being disrespectful or uncooperative to your peers, elders, house parents, and school authority attracts disciplinary measures which includes being reported to the Director of Hostels/Principal and depending on the gravity, a two week suspension from the hostel isapplied.
 - **14.** You must keep your room/corner tidy at all times. Failure to do so will makethe culprit dress all the beds in his/her room for 3days.
 - 15. Misusing school property is not allowed. Any damages caused by a student must be repaired, replaced or paid for by parents of the boarder at a cost determined by the schoolauthorities.
 - **16.** Dishonesty is highly frowned upon. These cases are referred to the counselling unit forsessions.
 - 17. No vernacular is allowed {not using English language} within the hostel. You will empty all the hostel/dining roomdustbins.
 - 18. Being late or absent from meals will not be tolerated. You will be made towash

plates in the kitchen.

- 19. Always line up correctly for events. Failure to comply will attract a delay in attending theevent.
- **20**. Bullying of any form is not permitted in the hostel. If a boarder is reported to be bullying another child, an investigation will be carried out, after which the parents of the boarder will be communicated to. This attracts automatic expulsion from thehostel.
- 21. Pick up of boarders by parents during a school term is prohibited except for emergency medical attention. Boarders will not be permitted to attend family occasions, trips, church activities such as confirmations or thanksgiving during the term. Any parent that insists on picking the child/ward from the hostel will not be permitted to bring the child back for the rest of the term without recourse to boarding feespaid.
- 22. Communication with parents are not allowed except done officially. In the event that this is observed, a letter is sent to the parent stating that the child would no longer be allowed to stay in the hostel in the subsequentterm(s).
- **23**. Collection of food/snacks from parents, siblings, non-boarders or staff members (even as small as bubble gum etc.) is not acceptable and attracts disciplinary actions. This will automatically mean the boarder will be suspended from thehostel.
- 24. All overtly loud, exuberant and boisterous activity should take place outside the hostel buildings. Under no circumstances should any kind of ball, Frisbee, orprojectile be used in thehostels
- 25. There is no reservation of hostel space. Preference is given to already existing boarders which when declined, is opened up to interested persons. Once the hostel capacity is reached in first term, no other child can be admitted except if there is vacancy in subsequentterms.
